Kara Gross Margolis, MD, practices general pediatric gastroenterology at NewYork-Presbyterian/Morgan Stanley Children's Hospital, with particular interest in intestinal inflammatory disorders (Crohn's disease, ulcerative colitis, eosinophilic esophagitis, and celiac disease), as well as gastrointestinal conditions in children with autism.

Dr. Gross Margolis's research focuses on the role of the nervous system in the gut and neurotransmitters in intestinal inflammation. Her translational research interests include inflammatory bowel disease (Crohn's disease and ulcerative colitis) and necrotizing enterocolitis. She is also a site principal investigator on a multicenter clinical study examining the prevalence of gastrointestinal conditions in children with autism.

Dr. Gross Margolis received her medical degree from the State University of New York at Buffalo in 2001, followed by an internship and residency at Albert Einstein College of Medicine, Montefiore Medical Center, in 2004. From 2004 to 2007, she pursued a fellowship in pediatric gastroenterology at Children's Hospital of Boston, Harvard Medical School.

Her honors include the Young Investigator's Award from the National Association for Pediatric Gastroenterology, Hepatology and Nutrition, a Columbia University Diversity Fellowship Award, a clinical and translational center research award, the John Driscoll Research Scholars Award, and the Louis V. Gerstner Research Scholar Award.
