Watching eight-year-old Peter summit the rock-climbing wall, you wouldn't believe that he has Cerebral Palsy, or that he's been through major surgery. When Peter was five, Dr. Roye suggested that, even though it was earlier than usual, surgery would improve Peter's physical abilities immediately. And, he explained, the early surgery could also help to stave off the joint deterioration that Cerebral Palsy patients often experience in their 20's.

Today Peter is a very active eight-year-old who also swims and does karate. "We have a very happy, social kid," says Peter's dad. "We are hopeful that the surgeries will delay future disabilities, but we are certain it was the right thing for him now."
