Ms. Brodlie also provides educational instruction to the pediatric gastroenterology fellows, house staff, and nursing staff.

Ms. Brodlie is principally interested in managing the specialized nutritional needs of children pre- and post-transplantation. She is also very involved in the nutritional support of children with intestinal failure.

Ms. Brodlie joined NewYork-Presbyterian/Morgan Stanley Children's Hospital in 1994 as a Pediatric Nutrition Support Specialist in the Gastroenterology and Nutrition service. Prior to that she served as a Pediatric/Obstetric Nutrition Coordinator at St. Luke's-Roosevelt Hospital Center.

Ms. Brodlie received a master of science degree in clinical nutrition from New York University in 1985, which was followed by a nutrition internship at Long Island College Hospital in 1986. In 2000, she became a Certified Nutrition Support Clinician.
